

youth are often called the "future" of the church. In one sense, that is so. However, after Confirmation and First Communion have been received, our teenagers are fully initiated Catholics who have been sacramentally graced by God to continue Christ's mission of reconciliation and evangelization in our world. They are fully part of the Church and its mission <u>now</u>. I am so proud of the work done by Kathy Russell, our Director of Youth Ministry, and of all of the Midland area youth ministers (both volunteer and parish staff) helping our young people grow into the "full stature of Christ." (Ephesians 4:13) One of the things that I love most about the Assumption Parish community is seeing the participation of our teenage parishioners, especially in liturgical, musical, and service ministries. Most of all, I am proud of our teenage parishioners. They are an example to all of us on how to energetically share our gifts and talents for the building up of the Body of Christ and of all of human society! Some of our high school youth are participating in the "Youth 2 Youth" Retreat this weekend. Let us all pray that they grow in friendship with Jesus this weekend, so that they can discern where God is calling them to best use their gifts to make our world a better place for everyone.

"Truly you have formed me in my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. I give you thanks for I am fearfully, wonderfully made; wonderful are your works."—Psalm 139:13-14

Also, this Monday through Wednesday we celebrate the Jubilee of People with Disabilities. We love our sports. We love to see athletes pushing themselves and their bodies to overcome obstacles to compete at the highest level. We sit in the stands or tune in on TV to see someone achieve something that no one has ever done before. This past summer, our parish friend and volunteer Doug Dean invited me to Miracle Field here in Midland to watch an adaptive baseball game on a Saturday morning. I had so much fun watching the athletes, with their diverse abilities and disabilities, enjoying the opportunity to engage in sports, in its competitive spirit and in its camaraderie of teamwork. It was a truly exceptional sports experience, inclusive of the unique abilities and dignity of all. People with disabilities: temporary, acquired, or permanent are a gift and blessing to everyone. They are special witnesses to the truth that the wonder of being human is not primarily about what

we <u>do</u>, but what we <u>are</u>: the image of God, created to be loved and to love. We are all on this Earth to compassionately serve each other. People with disabilities force everyone to slow down and care for each other in love. This is not always easy, especially for caregivers. God continues to bless our parish community and Midland area community with people with various disabilities and their caregivers and supporters so that everyone can grow in humanity, compassion and unconditional love. We are thankful for each and every person in our community, especially persons with disabilities!

Finally, today is Divine Mercy Sunday. We mark this day with sad but hopeful hearts since we are both celebrating the end of the Easter Octave and the continuation of the Easter Season while at the same time observing nine days of mourning for the

death of Pope Francis. One thing that we know for certain is that Pope Francis put all his faith and hope in Jesus' Cross and Resurrection which brings us mercy, the forgiveness of sins, and the promise of eternal life. He wrote a book entitled, The Name of God is Mercy. May we be inspired to keep his spirit alive in our parish and in the worldwide Church through a renewed commitment to let Jesus encounter us with his unconditional, merciful love in a deep, personal friendship; through furthering Pope Francis' commitment to humility and service, compassionately caring for the poor, the immigrants and refugees, the forgotten and marginalized, and vulnerable people; through heeding his heartfelt call to steward and care for all of God's creation, our common home; and through living in solidarity and communion with all people, not putting up walls but building bridges of dialogue and understanding.

The final words of Pope Francis' last will and testament read, "the suffering that marked the final part of my life, I offer to the Lord, for peace in the world and for fraternity among peoples." May we take up the challenge of this final gift from our Holy Father, rejecting the polarization and division that underlies the violence and hatred in our world and building a world where "todos, todos, todos" ("everyone, everyone, everyone") can live together in dignity, justice, peace, and mutual love with

God and each other.



Statement from Bishop Robert Gruss on the Death of Pope Francis

April 21, 2025

Diocese of Saginaw

"It is with profound sadness that we have learned of the passing of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, on this April 21, 2025. Trusting in the infinite mercy of God, we commend his soul to the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father, praying that he be granted eternal rest.

As one who was blessed to be appointed Bishop of Saginaw by Pope Francis in 2019, and who personally met him later that year, I was moved by his presence, his humility, and his openness. His candor to the many questions raised by my brother bishops left a lasting impression upon me.

Pope Francis dedicated his papacy to lifting up the poor, the marginalized, and those living on the peripheries of society. His life was a profound witness to the Gospel call of mercy, humility, and compassion. His actions, especially in moments like the Holy Thursday foot-washing of migrants and prisoners, embodied his call for a Church that is merciful, inclusive, and attentive to those most often forgotten.

Throughout his ministry, Pope Francis consistently reminded us of the joy of the Gospel, the importance of care for creation, and the dignity of every human person. His leadership challenged us to build bridges, not walls; to seek peace, not division; and to be a Church that journeys with the wounded and the weary.

We give thanks to God for the life and witness of Pope Francis, a humble servant of the Lord and of His people. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace."



Pastoral Council Call for Discernment of New Members

The PASTORAL COUNCIL of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Larkin Township, Midland, Michigan exists in accordance with church law to assist the Director of Parish Life in providing pastoral leadership and direction through a process of collaboration and consensus, seeking to build up a community of disciples that responds to their baptismal call to holiness, witness, and service. The council meets a minimum of 6 times throughout the year.

The first responsibility of the Pastoral Council is to be attentive listeners. First and foremost, prayerfully heeding the Word of God, along with the inspirations and needs of parishioners and the pastoral vision and directives of the Bishop of Saginaw.

The second responsibility of the Pastoral Council is to engage the parish in pastoral planning, discerning and prioritizing specific and measurable long-term pastoral initiatives in the context of parish, diocesan, and civic life. The Pastoral Council assists in the preparation of the Pastoral Plan and is guided in its activity by it.

This summer, we will have a number of open positions on the Pastoral Council. All are asked to pray for the insight of the Holy Spirit as we discern the candidates for membership on the Pastoral Council.

The discernment process begins with a nomination process. We are now beginning the process to solicit the names of nominees for the open seats. You are encouraged to nominate someone who you think would have the qualifications to serve capably on the Pastoral Council. You may also self-nominate.

The following are the prerequisites to serve on the Pastoral Council:

- Registered member of the parish. All are welcome, both new and long-time parishioners.
- Practicing Catholic who regularly participates in parish worship, community, and service.
- Adult (18+)—there is a separate process for youth council members.
- Parish employees and their immediate family members may not be nominated. Spouses, siblings, and parent/(adult)child may not serve on the council simultaneously.

Nominees will be informed of their nomination and asked if they are willing and able to serve on the council. They will then be invited to a nominee orientation this spring. Of those nominees, the current council members and Director of Parish Life will discern which nominees will best fill the available vacancies based on the current needs of the council. The names of nominees not selected will be retained as alternates should a mid-term replacement be needed.

PASTORAL COUNCIL NOMINATION FORM

All nominees to our Pastoral Council must be:

- A registered member of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary parish. All are welcome, both new and long-time parishioners.
- Practicing Catholic who regularly participates in parish worship, community, and service.
- Adult (18+)—there is a separate process for youth council members.
- Parish employees and their immediate family members may not be nominated. Spouses, siblings, and parent/(adult)child may not serve on the council simultaneously.

Nominees will be informed of their nomination and asked if they are willing and able to serve on the council. They will then be invited to a nominee orientation. Of those nominees, the current council members and Director of Parish Life will discern which nominees will best fill the available vacancies based on the current needs of the council. The names of nominees not selected will be retained as alternates should a mid-term replacement be needed.

The term of office shall be 3 years with a limit of 2 successive terms (6 years). The first responsibility of the Pastoral Council is to be attentive listeners. First and foremost, prayerfully heeding the Word of God, along with the inspirations and needs of parishioners and the pastoral vision and directives of the Bishop of Saginaw. The second responsibility of the Pastoral Council is to engage the parish in pastoral planning, discerning and prioritizing specific and measurable long-term pastoral initiatives in the context of parish, diocesan, and civic life. The Pastoral Council assists in the preparation of the Pastoral Plan and is guided in its activity by it.

Responsibilities of a Pastoral Council member include attendance and active participation in scheduled Pastoral Council meetings.
