

From our Director of Parish Life



"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me, far from my prayer, from the words of my cry? O my God, I cry out by day, and you answer not; by night, and there is no relief for me." – Psalm 22:2-3

Today, we commemorate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This

year, we liturgically celebrate this feast under the shadow of the tragic events just a few weeks ago at Annunciation Parish and School in Minneapolis, where in an act of sinful hatred and violence, children were attacked, wounded, and killed while participating in the Eucharist.

One of the most profound kinds of prayers is the prayer of lament. We talk about prayers of praise, adoration, and petition more often because we naturally tend toward experiences, even spiritual experiences, which are pleasurable rather than those that are painful. But according to Mark Vroegop, author of the book, Dark Clouds Deep Mercy: Discovering the Grace of Lament, "the practice of lament talks to God about pain. It has a unique purpose: trust. It is a divinelygiven invitation to pour out our fears, frustrations, and sorrows." About onethird of the Psalms in the Bible are classified as laments, and Jesus prayed a lament, Psalm 22, while he hung dying on his cross. Lament is a dialogue with God in the midst of suffering where our very lives become a question "thrown at" God. God is never threatened by our honestly laying bare our hearts in prayer. But in the end, every prayer of lament concludes with an act of trust in God, even in the moment of our greatest distress.

"Jesus answered them, 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say: Father, save me from this hour? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour: Father, glorify your name. Then a voice came from heaven: I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'" – John 12:27-28

There is no philosophical or theological reason to the question of suffering, why bad things happen to good people or why those acting immorally seem to prosper, why children suffer violence and disease. As we were reminded in last weekend's reading from the

Book of Wisdom, "Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the Lord intends?" God's answer to human suffering and death cannot be reduced to a logical argument. It is the gift of his eternal Son, Jesus, who did not grasp at his divinity, but humbled himself to suffer with us (com-passio), becoming obedient unto death, death on a cross. (Philippians 2: 6-8) The obedience and compassion of Jesus undoes the selfishness and violence of sin, precisely by displacing himself from comfort to suffer with us all the violence, mental and physical, that we humans daily commit against each other. Thus, Jesus becomes the reconciliation between God and human beings and between humans. As expressed so beautifully by theologian Romano Guardini in his book, The Lord, "God followed us into the no man's land which sin had ripped open. God not only glanced down at us and summoned us lovingly to return, he personally entered into that vacuous dark to fetch us . . . God alone can 'handle' sin. Only God sees through it, weighs it, judges it with a judgment that condemns the sin but loves the sinner. Attempting the same, we would break. This then is the Love, re-establisher of justice . . . known as Grace." In the face of the ugliness, violence, and hatred unleashed at Christ's Passion, the glorious triumph of the Cross is the triumph of compassion over selfishness, obedience over pride, and non-violent love over the machinations of human power.

"The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it." – Matthew 13:45--46

As we continue the Jubilee Year of Hope, this weekend we celebrate the **Jubilee of Consolation**. Consolation ministry is when we, united with and in Christ, displace ourselves out of our comfort zones and compassionately accompany those who are experiencing loss, illness, violence, or abuse. Over the past year, two of our parish-

ioners, Denise Kearl and Marcia Schneider, have been participating in a leadership formation process to bring this kind of ministry to Assumption Parish. BeFriender Ministry is an active listening ministry, a ministry of consolation to those who are undergoing times of illness, grief, or loss. They provide the nonjudgemental presence of Jesus to those who need to talk about their trials and suffering; not counseling or giving advice but loving through confidential listening. This weekend, Marcia and Denise will witness before Masses and be commissioned for their ministry. Our next step is for them to call forth the gifts of compassion in our parishioners, inviting us to be trained in this ministry of mercy and training a core group of BeFriender ministers. When these volunteers are formed, we can begin offering this service to our neighbors in need, hopefully in early 2026. Please open your hearts to their appeal for volunteers and discern in prayer if God is calling you to move beyond your comfort zone to accompany our sisters and brothers in need.

May we as a parish community honestly and courageously receive the uncomfortable benefits of lament, standing in prayerful communion beneath the glorious Cross of Christ, so that each one of us may find healing, reconciliation, and peace while accompanying as compassionate servant ministers those in pain and grief, bringing them consolation in the midst of their suffering.

Guatemalan Stove Team Mission 2026

The success of this Mission has been possible through the generosity of parishioners who donate to or volunteer in this effort. We've helped 1300+ families in the past decade and have committed to send a team again in February 2026, in partnership with HELPS International, targeting to help another 150+ families.

The water filters and vented stoves provided to the rural poor are truly life changing. The stoves replace a smoky fire pit on the floor of the homes, run with 70% less wood, and save the family hours of work each week or, if purchased, about 40% of their income. The water filters eliminate the risk of waterborne illnesses (e.g. dysentery), a leading cause of death, especially in children.





Pier Giorgio Frassati

(1901-1925)

The Man of the Beatitudes
An Italian layman known for his deep faith, love for the poor, and joy-filled spirit. As a college student and avid mountain climber, he devoted his life to prayer, service, and friendship. Beatified in 1990, he inspires young people to

live boldly for Christ with joy and generosity.

Carlo Acutis (1991 – 2006)

The First Millennial Saint

An Italian teen whose love for the Eucharist and skill with technology led him to create a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles—earning him the nickname "God's influencer." Diagnosed with leukemia at 15, he offered his sufferings for the Pope and the Church, living a heroic vet ordinary life of faith.



Now that we have reached Labor Day weekend, spiritual enrichment opportunities will be available every day of the week! How might the Lord be calling you to grow in faith throughout the week? Take a moment to prayerfully consider these opportunities!

SUNDAY -

- Children's Liturgy of the Word & Faith Formation: We partner with parents to help their children better hear and understand the Word of God and grow in knowledge of our Catholic beliefs, liturgy, and moral way of life in an age-appropriate manner.
- Youth Ministry: We partner with parents and local Catholic parishes to help our young people deepen their faith though meaningful interactions with God in prayer, discussion with caring volunteer adults and their peers, and service to the community.
- Catholic Inquiry: This is an opportunity for anyone to get their questions about Catholicism answered so that they can better discern God's plan for their life.

MONDAY -

- **Stitch & Prayer:** This interdenominational group uses skills of knitting, crocheting, sewing, and quilting to prayerfully serve the sick, needy, and homebound.
- **The Chosen:** On Monday evenings, Assumption parishioner Donna Semanco will be leading sessions exploring the 5th Season of *The Chosen* television program. Many have expressed how their understanding of Jesus and his ministry has "come alive" through this program. *Also offered on Wednesday afternoons.*

TUESDAY -

- Morning Meditation: After morning Mass and Rosary, participants are led on a 20-minute guided meditation on CD written by Mother Teresa. Through this graced use of imagination, participants feel Jesus speaking his words of comfort directly to us.
- Millions of Monicas Prayer Group: On Tuesday afternoons, a growing group of women meet to pray for their loved ones' return to the full practice of their Catholic faith. This is not a sharing or discussion group, but an organized way to support each other in prayer.

WEDNESDAY -

• Weekly Evening of Encounter with Christ: We celebrate an evening Mass followed by Eucharistic Exposition/Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a perfect "halfway" point to the week! Children's Faith Formation is also offered at this time, so parents can recharge their spiritual batteries while their children are growing in their understanding of the Catholic faith.

THURSDAY -


- Scripture Study & Reflection: After morning Mass and Rosary, participants study and reflect upon the Bible readings of the upcoming weekend liturgy, gaining deeper insight into Bible history, context, and spirituality.
- **Music Ministry:** On Thursday evenings, our choir and instrumentalists prepare and practice music for the upcoming weekend liturgies and concerts. Participants develop their gifts and grow spiritually through interaction with sacred music and texts. "The one who sings, prays twice!"

FRIDAY -

• Morning Mass & Rosary: A wonderful start to your day and weekend: gathering to share in prayer and receive our Lord in Word and Sacrament!

SATURDAY -

• Men's Awakening Faith Group: On 2nd and 4th Saturdays, our Knights of Columbus sponsor a men's faith enrichment group, offering the opportunity to grow in prayer, share discussion, and build community. This group is not just for Knights but is open to all men.






