

Kids are back in school, Labor Day is over, and football is back – regardless of when the solstice is or what the forecast says, it's fall! Fall means cool air, cozy sweaters, and pumpkin spice EVERYTHING! Today, fall also means that Children's Faith Formation (CFF) and Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) are both starting. I'm so excited, and I know our 5-year-old is too! Just about every week this summer he asked me two things: 1. Do I have to serve? 2. Am I going to my class?

A couple of weeks ago, John talked about Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) and how its method applies to the pillars of education. Today, I would like to share why CGS is so important to me.

I first fell in love with CGS when our oldest, now 16, was 3 years old; we were living in Grand Rapids at the time, and she went to St. Thomas the Apostle School. At St. Thomas, the preschool teachers are CGS trained, so they had their first experience during class. When I saw the City of Jerusalem. I was hooked. It was a wooden model of the city that they could pick up and work with: the walls, the buildings, the temple, the trees in the garden on the Mount of Olives, the cross atop Calvary, the pools. Everything. Wow. Two and four years later, her brothers joined her.

I remember one day, our second oldest came home and started talking about the Fettuccia and Parousia. What? I'm a cradle Catholic, but I must have missed that week of CCD. Well. Fettuccia is an Italian ribbon yarn, but it's also the very long ribbon that we use to show the History of the Kingdom of God. Parousia is a Greek word meaning "presence" or "arrival". In Christianity, it refers to the second coming of Christ when we will be with Him for eternity. It's not heaven, where one's soul eventually goes when they die (hopefully); Parousia is the beautiful forever at the end of time. This is pretty big stuff, why is my first grader talking about this?

In CGS, we have these beautiful presentations that are all rooted in the Bible and the Liturgy. In Level I (ages 3-Kindergarten), the children learn about the items used at Mass: the chalice, patten, cruets, altar, ambo,

lectern, sanctuary lamp, tabernacle, ciborium, etc. They learn what these items are not because we tell them and show them a picture, but because they get to work hands-on with the items. We don't have plastic adaptations, we have smaller versions of the real items, made of glass and metal. Yes, glass dishes for little kids. We help them learn to make silence, to use careful hands, and walking feet. They can do it! We have vestments for the priest, articles of Baptism (including Holy Water AND fire), and so much more. We also have practical life works that help the child hone their life-skills: pouring, scooping, threading, and weaving, among others.

But the most important concept we help them with has nothing to do with knowing the name of the chalice or the Liturgical colors – it's about a relationship with Jesus. We help them learn how to sit with God, to listen to His call, to recognize and appreciate His gifts, to follow His word. CGS isn't about learning concrete facts, it's about meeting God. Too many times, we have heard stories of someone raised Catholic, but they didn't meet Jesus until they went elsewhere. We're trying to change that. We want the children to not just meet Jesus, but to have a relationship with Him. We want them to know He is always there for them and cares for them. He is the Good Shepherd.

Being a catechist in a CGS atrium is also different because we are not there to teach in the traditional sense. We present to the children, then we guide them in additional discovery. We ask them questions such as, "I wonder what Mary was thinking/feeling?" when talking about the various miraculous moments surrounding the birth of Jesus. We present the Gifts to them (the various plants, animals, minerals, and people that God has created for us) and inquire, "Did one of these stand out more than the others? I wonder if you could express or share your idea using some of our materials?" We invite them to copy prayers and verses, trace images, and discover further. We are guides on their journey; the direction they go is up to each of them.

Going through the catechist training is more than I had ever imagined, but in a good way. We have approximately 100 hours of class, reading, and work for each level of CGS (there are three levels). It sounds intense, and it kind of is, but it's beautiful! I try not to be intimidated by remembering that God doesn't call the prepared, He prepares the called.

I am so incredibly thankful that God brought our family to St. Thomas where we were first introduced to this beautiful program. I am also so very thankful that God guided our family here to ABVM to this incredible parish and has blessed us with a growing CGS program. I am thankful for our catechists: Emily, Shannon, Larissa, and Maria; our aides: Grandma Mary, Elizabeth, Benjamin, and Matthew; and the volunteers that have helped with various materials: Gregg, Ken, Dave, Anna, Stitch & Prayer, the previous Level I materials makers, and anyone else I may have missed. I am also thankful for each of you - thankful for your prayers and support for our Children's Faith Formation program and our family. From the bottom of my heart, thank you.

If you feel like you might be called to be a catechist or an aide, or even if you just want to sit in on a session and see what it's all about, please contact me! I'd love to hear from you!

Guatemalan Stove Team Mission 2026

The success of this Mission has been possible through the generosity of parishioners who donate to or volunteer in this effort. We've helped 1300+ families in the past decade and have committed to send a team again in February 2026, in partnership with HELPS International, targeting to help another 150+ families.

The water filters and vented stoves provided to the rural poor are truly life changing. The stoves replace a smoky fire pit on the floor of the homes, run with 70% less wood, and save the family hours of work each week or, if purchased, about 40% of their income. The water filters eliminate the risk of waterborne illnesses (e.g. dysentery), a leading cause of death, especially in children.



Now that we have reached Labor Day weekend, spiritual enrichment opportunities will be available every day of the week! How might the Lord be calling you to grow in faith throughout the week? Take a moment to prayerfully consider these opportunities!

SUNDAY

- Children's Liturgy of the Word & Faith Formation: We partner with parents to help their children better hear and understand the Word of God and grow in knowledge of our Catholic beliefs, liturgy, and moral way of life in an age-appropriate manner.
- Youth Ministry: We partner with parents and local Catholic parishes to help our young people deepen their faith though meaningful interactions with God in prayer, discussion with caring volunteer adults and their peers, and service to the community.
- Catholic Inquiry: This is an opportunity for anyone to get their questions about Catholicism answered so that they can better discern God's plan for their life.

MONDAY -

- Millions of Monicas Prayer Group: On Tuesday afternoons, a growing group of women meet to pray for their loved ones' return to the full practice of their Catholic faith. This is not a sharing or discussion group, but an organized way to support each other in prayer.

WEDNESDAY -

• Weekly Evening of Encounter with Christ: We celebrate an evening Mass followed by Eucharistic Exposition/Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a perfect "halfway" point to the week! Children's Faith Formation is also offered at this time, so parents can recharge their spiritual batteries while their children are growing in their understanding of the Catholic faith.

THURSDAY

- Scripture Study & Reflection: After morning Mass and Rosary, participants study and reflect upon the Bible readings of the upcoming weekend liturgy, gaining deeper insight into Bible history, context, and spirituality.
- Music Ministry: On Thursday evenings, our choir and instrumentalists prepare and practice music for the upcoming weekend liturgies and concerts. Participants develop their gifts and grow spiritually through interaction with sacred music and texts. "The one who sings, prays twice!"



Minutes of Meeting / August 19, 2025 - 5:30 p.m.

Actions and Discussions:

We opened with the Faith Formation Commission Prayer.

1) Adult Faith Formation – John Graveline

- a. Catholicism Clarified has been well attended through the summer. Materials can be used by catechists of an OCIA team.
- b. Preparation for a few baptisms are in progress for late summer and early fall.
- c. Inquiry sessions will be held Sunday morning after Mass this fall.
- d. There are a few people working with John and staff in various phases of the OCIA.
- e. Thursday Scripture reflection starts Sept 4th.
- f. The Chosen, led by Donna Semanco, will begin Sept 8th and Sept 10th.
- g. The K of C Saturday morning men's faith study will begin in September, meeting twice a month.

2) Youth Ministry – Kathy Russell

- a. MS & HS YM registration is in progress, but are lagging.
- b. There are five sessions remaining for the current Confirmation preparation group.
- c. The next Confirmation group starts in January for ages 12 years old and up.
- d. Y2Y Team sign-up will be held on Sept 8th.
- e. 12 spots reserved for NCYC, 6 spots remain available.

3) Children's Faith Formation – Wendy Graveline

- a. CFF starts Sept 7th. Registrations are in progress, but are lagging.
 - i. A parent meeting will also be held on Sept. 7th.
 - ii. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Level 1 and Level 2 will be offered. 4th-5th graders will have a bible study format.


